The ability to sin comes naturally to us humans. However, the best of us are those who after having committed a sin feel the guilt and shame upon it and thus seek Allah's SWT forgiveness for it with a firm resolve to never repeat that sin.

Our beloved Prophet has said that all of the children of Adam are sinners and the best of sinners are those who make Tawbah repeatedly. (Mishkaat)

Sins come in different shapes and sizes

There are three major types of sinners among humans:

- -The first one consists of those who sin and then outrightly deny that it was a sin; they don't even admit that it was a sin, let alone feel guilty about it.
- -The second type consists of those who sin and then start looking for ways to justify it; just like Iblees, who disobeyed Allah SWT and then tried to present logical reasons and justifications for it.
- -The third type of sinners consists of those who sin and then acknowledge it and thus ask for forgiveness over it.

Just like Prophet Adam AS; he sinned but then immediately admitted his mistake and presented his helplessness before Allah SWT with extreme humility. He begged Allah SWT to teach him the way to undo his mistake; he said he was ready to do just anything that would make Allah SWT happy with him again.

There was such purity in Prophet Adam's acknowledgement of his mistake and such humility in his begging before Allah SWT that Allah SWT then taught him the way of forgiveness Himself.

"Then Adam learned certain words (to pray with) from his Lord; so, Allah accepted his repentance." (Al-Bagarah: 37)

And it was not just any ordinary way to seek forgiveness; it was an exceptional way that all of the progeny of Prophet Adam AS has been blessed with. So before Prophet Adam AS descended to this earth, he had been equipped with the best of Duas for seeking forgiveness from sins: "Our Lord, we have wronged ourselves, and if You do not forgive us and have mercy upon us, we will surely be among the losers." (Al-Aaraaf: 23)

That is just why one of the beautiful names of Allah SWT is Al-Hakeem (All-Wise); when He gave us this free will, thus an ability to sin, simultaneously He has not left us without telling how to fix it all.

The reality of sins

Hence we have been taught how to wash and get rid of our sins, but in order to benefit from that, we must first realise and acknowledge what sin is.

As per definition, to do anything against the orders of Allah SWT is a sin. So the first thing we need to realise is that a sin is what is bad according to Allah's SWT standards. It's a shame that today's messed up society only considers those things wrong which are wrong according to the people's or the society's standards.

One would see a lady strolling in a park at early morning, a rosary in one hand and yet, observing Pardah. Why? remaining without Pardah is not considered to be bad in our society. A man holding the same rosary could be seen going about collecting his interest-based instalments because indulging in interest is normal in our society now. A person may be involved in huge philanthropic projects on one hand and yet, on the other hand, he would unfairly withhold payments that he has to make to some people and also would routinely lie because not fulfilling other's rights and lying are not much looked down upon in our society anymore. People would apparently be very religious minded, yet would have no guilt in having non-segregated gender interaction in their family affairs because that is what the norm of the society is.

This is why it is absolutely important that we realise the reality of sins.

The doorway to Tawbah

Acknowledging the reality of sins is absolutely vital because unless one doesn't acknowledge an act to be a sin, the chances that

he would even come close to feeling bad about it or repenting from it are nil. There cannot be a bigger loss for a person who thinks that he has repented from his sins and imagines himself to be a pious person but in reality, there are things he does that are not even included in his 'list of sins' because he has made that list according to the society's standards and not according to Allah's SWT criteria.

So it is very important to remember that sin is the disobedience of Allah's SWT commands; the things that our beloved Prophet warned us against. No matter how much it is liked and accepted by people, no matter how common it becomes and no matter how appreciated are the people who are indulging in it – a sin yet remains a sin.

A sugar-coated poison

That is what a sin is; it's like swallowing something which is apparently sweet and delightful but essentially it is poisonous. Sins also offer apparent pleasure but in reality, they lead a person to his spiritual death.

Or we can say that sin is tantamount to a person who has allergy on his skin, scratches it and feels temporary relief/pleasure from it. But what if he persists upon this practice? He'll finally rip off his skin and the wounds would then develop an infection. That is what exactly sinning does to a person! Apparently, he attains pleasure from it but slowly it starts taking its toll; he starts feeling restless, loses sleep, loses contentment and peace of the heart, continuously remains unsatisfied and finally loses all interest and fun in life.

May Allah SWT help us to stay away from all forms of sin. Ameen.

With already approximately 4.59 billion social media users, the time to argue whether it is beneficial or not is long gone. The answer is clearer than ever. IT IS NOT! Day after day, we are being ruined by something that is not even alive. All of us, literally every single one of us has heard about it's side effects, fuelling anxiety, depression and whatnot. This is the cause of all our problem, and the worst part is that we are turning blind to it. Let me elaborate with some examples.

What we have here is let's say a 14-year-old girl well teen to be exact but anyways, she is a social media user or influencer, whatever suits you, posting every single thing in her life. Hadhrat Safia belonged to one of the most respectable Jewish family of Arabia. Her father, Hayee bin Akhtab was the chief of the tribe of Banu Nazeer while her ancestral chain linked her with Prophet Haroon

She was first married to a famous poet and Rabbi Salam bin Miskam who later divorced her. She was then married to a tribal leader and a harsh opponent of our Prophet , Kinaana ibn al Rabi, who was killed by the Muslims during the Battle of Khyber.

Battle of Khyber became the last nail in coffin for the military and political power of the Jews. Many of their people and leaders were killed making them weak enough to start beating about the bush and trying to conspire a war against the Muslims. Many prisoners and armour were also another benefit of this battle.

An Example of Courage

Hadhrat Safia and her sister were among these prisoners. When they were brought before the Prophet , her sister started wailing and cursing loudly looking at the dead bodies of their relatives but Hadhrat Safia controlled her nerves and soberly sat in a corner though the agony could be seen from her face.

Marriage to Prophet

At the time of distribution of the booty, Hadhrat Dahiya Kalbi asked for a maid servant. Prophet Muhammad allowed him to pick one for himself. He chose Hadhrat Safia . The companions of the Prophet felt that it would be more suitable if the Prophet kept her for himself as she belonged to the most respected tribes of Jews and was the daughter of the chief of Banu Nazeer and wife of the chief of Banu Quraiza.

Hadhrat Muhammad was soft hearted and merciful. He released Hadhrat Safia and gave her a choice: "You are free to return to your family or if you agree, you can marry me."

Hadhrat Safia opted for the latter offer and accepted Islam. Her wedding with our honourable Prophet took place at Khyber.

Results of this Marriage

These marriages of Rasulullah have much wisdom attached to them but these are only visible to those who look into the real wisdom of why Prophet took certain decisions during the course of his life. His aura is spread through more than fourteen hundred years and these visions are visible to those who are benefitted through that.

Three days before Prophet's arrival at Khyber, she saw in her dream that a brilliant moon came from Madinah towards Khyber and fell in her lap. Later on, she narrated the dream to her husband who struck her on her face assuming that she wished for the King of Madinah. She was a beautiful woman and the marks of this aggression were seen on her face.

This dream helped her in taking the decision and she opted to become the wife of the Blessed Prophet . She was elevated to the Prophet's household with the title, Ummul Momineen (Mother of the Believers).

Surpassing Bloodline

Sometimes Hadhrat Safia got upset when women called her of the Jewish origin. Regarding this, once Prophet said to her that she should answer the women by saying, 'Haroon is my father, Musa my uncle and Muhammad my husband.'

Social Dealings

Seerah of Hadhrat Safia also teaches young girls and women an important lesson on how to win the hearts of their in laws and create an atmosphere of harmony. When she reached Madinah after her marriage, Hadhrat Fatima came to meet her. She gave Hadhrat Fatima her earrings as a gift. She also gave presents to other wives of Prophet She had good social manners and this was the main reason that Prophet loved her too.

She was a nice cook as well. Hadhrat Ayesha had said, "I have not seen a better cook than Safia."


Service to Islam







Design Your Own Planet



Imagination is a spark needed to make the best inventions or art. In this activity, Design Your Own Planet, learners will imagine a new planet in the solar system. What will it look like? What are the inhabitants like? Children can let their imaginations run wild and include as much scientific thinking as they desire with this design challenge. While you are leading your child through the activity, allow them to work independently. Geared toward children from preschool through second grade, this fun activity will intertwine arts with science, and get your child's creative juices flowing.

What You Need:

Internet access

Craft materials around the house. Some ideas are:

1)Paper 2) Tape 3) Glue 4) Balloons 5)Paint 6)Paintbrushes 7)Construction paper

What You Do:

- 1. Do a search online for pictures of Earth from outer space and show them to your child. Talk to your child about what Earth looks like, and discuss
- different environments, such as rainforest or deserts.
- 2. Now show them online photos of other planets and explain that there are other planets in our solar system. Ask your learner, "Can you design and make your own planet?"
- 3. Encourage your child to make a *plan*. Ask your learner, "What will your planet look like? What animals will live on the planet? What is the name of your planet? What materials do you need to make your vision come true?"
- 4. Give your child some craft materials and have them *create* their design. Allow them to work independently, but be available with ideas and suggestions if they ask for help. As your child creates their planet, ask them, "Is

- this what you imagined? What other materials do you need for your planet?"
- 5. Tell your little designer to *play* with their new planet. Have them imagine landing on their planet in a spaceship. What would they do? What would they see?
- 6. After imagining their journey through their planet, ask your child what ways they can adjust their design. For example, ask questions like, "What do you want to change about your planet? What do you wish your planet had?"
- 7. Have your creator make any changes they find necessary.
- 8. Challenge designers to **share** their planet. They can record a video or draw their design on paper. They can mention what the planet looks like, what the temperature and environment is like, and what animals live on the planet.

Amplify this challenge! If your child enjoyed this challenge, take them one step further. Ask them one or more of these questions:

Can you create different ecosystems or environments on your planet?

Can you imagine other creatures living on the planet that do not exist on Earth? Do they breathe? What do they do?



Fun facts about Solar System

- -Solar System includes a star (in our case the Sun) and all objects that orbit around it.
- Sun contains 99.86% of all of the solar system's known mass.
 - There are 8 planets in our solar system.
 - Neptune was the last planet to be discovered.
- Saturn's ring particles are made almost entirely of water ice particles.
- Earth is the only known planet that has oceans (as far as we know for now).
 - Mercury is the smallest and lightest planet in our solar system.
 - There are 4 outer and 4 inner planets in our solar system.
- The whole of Mars is as cold as the South Pole
 You can't stand on Uranus. That's because Jupiter, Saturn,
 Uranus and Neptune don't have solid surfaces they have a
 rocky core, but are mainly big balls of hydrogen and helium.
